

June 11, 1983

The first regular meeting of the southern Oregon/northern California Quilters' Guild was called to order by president, Dora Scheidecker, in the Grants Pass community Clubhouse.

Pat Hatfield, G.P., gave the treasurer's report. Rick, of Plaza Sewing Center, G.P. donated \$100; \$285 had been received in membership dues; \$271 from Ione McIntyre's lecture; and \$63 from her workshop. Expenses were \$232, leaving a balance of \$487.

At the first meeting, it had been decided that annual dues would be \$5.

There was a general discussion of the McIntyre lecture and demonstration. The consensus was that both were excellent.

Dora asked for suggestions and opinions regarding future programs: how often? who? what? She appointed Mary Wead, G.P., Mary Wilson, G.P. and Joyce Coulter, Hugo, as a committee to review possible meeting places and programs.

After several suggestions, we voted to be called "Mountain Stars Quilters Guild". This name is considered to cover all interested quilters from Roseburg south; north from Weed, Calif. and east to Hlamath Falls.

Proposed By-Laws were read. Articles I, II, and III were accepted as read; IV was changed from "alternate" to "rotate among". This refers to our meetings, which will be held quarterly on the 2nd Saturday of June, September, December, and March at 1 P.M.

Section 2 was amended to read "quorum will consist of 20 persons" (Present were 24 women; membership presently is about 50).

With the changes noted above, acceptance of the by-laws was unanimous.

It was moved and passed that our newsletter would be called "Mountain Stars Newsletter".

There was discussion regarding a logo for the guild. It was suggested there be a contest to choose an appropriate one. No definite action was taken.

Dora appointed Carol Douglas G.P. as historian.

At the next meeting, to be held at the Hugo Women's Clubhouse Sept. 12, at 1 o'clock, Dora will give an applique demo derived from Ione McIntyre's workshop.

Margaret Hunsaker suggested the Dec. Meeting be in Ashland when most stores have miniature displays in their windows, which would be an added attraction for those attending. No decisions was made.

Meeting adjourned by president, Dora Scheidecker.
