

MOUNTAIN STARS QUILTERS' GUILD

The Mountain Stars general meeting was held March 10, 1984, at the Rogue River Civic Center at 1 p.m.

The general meeting minutes from December were read. The Treasurer's report was read. The ending balance as of March 10 was \$538.68. At the time of this meeting there are 79 members.

Pat Hatfield moved the annual membership dues be one half price when less than six months remain in the fiscal year. Seconded, Gerry Lewis. Motion carried.

Joyce Couiter reported Katie Pasquini will hold a lecture and workshop in Jacksonville on May 19. The day before, May 18, she will present a workshop only in Hugo. The Saturday Lecture will be from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Workshop will be from one to four in the afternoon. Times for the Friday workshop not established. Lecture fee is \$3 and workshop fee is \$10. Joyce also announced that Mary Cross is presenting a lecture on Grant Wood and the quilts in his paintings on April 11. She will also be available to document quilts. Suzy Lawson has been contacted as to availability. She has one date free in September. She has two six hour programs: Amish quilting and Pictorial Quilts.

Helen Miller of Rogue River has volunteered to be the new Newsletter editor. The new Historian will be Mabel Rynnion (Grants Pass).

Mary Wead (Grants Pass) discussed the Heritage Quilt Club show to be held April 11-12, 1984. The show will be held in Grants Pass that will be raffled. Mary reported that the city of Grants Pass will be celebrating its Centennial Birthday and a Commemorative Quilt will be assembled. Individual blocks 12½ by 12½ inches will be collected and judged, with cash prizes awarded. No dates yet.

Name tags for members were discussed. It was moved, seconded, and carried that commercial tags will be purchased and each member may add to it as desired. Each member will pay for her own. A sign-up sheet was passed around.

6-9-84 Anita Ledwidge of the Hugo Group will handle the publicity for the Mary Cross lecture. It was announced that an all-day workshop for Needle Artists will be held in Grants Pass March 19. The Ashland Quilt Show will be held July 3 through 25 at the Methodist Church. Jean Strand and Maxine Kincaid will approve quilts to be displayed on April 28 at the home of Maxine, 34 Kent St., Ashland. Telephone 482-4692.


Pat Hatfield has proposed a change in the By-Laws. The change would involve Article 11. Section 3d. The last sentence under duties of the Secretary currently reads: "The Secretary shall maintain the membership list." Pat has suggested that since the Treasurer already has the membership list as part of her duties in collecting dues, this sentence be eliminated from the Secretary's duties and be added to the Treasurer's duties. The change, if

approved, would mean that Article 11, Section 3c shall read:
"The Treasurer shall act as custodian of the funds, collect dues and fees, and present an itemized account of receipts and disbursements at each business meeting, copies subsequently to be filed with the President and the Secretary. The Treasurer shall maintain the membership list."

The nominating committee met on February 12, 1984 and has suggested the following slate of officers:

There were no nominations from the floor. It was moved and seconded that a unanimous ballot be cast for the slate of officers as presented. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:15 p.m., after the announcement that the next meeting will be at the Jacksonville Ballroom, June 9, 1984, at one p.m.
