March 9, 1985

Discussion of future programs and workshops followed. Yvonne Porcella's availability will be checked into. The possibility of Mountain Stars holding its own quilt show in the spring of 1986 will be investigated. Committee: Anita Ledwidge, Dorothy Herberg, and Barbara Sabol.

There was discussion on whether or not the pattern for the club banner should be offered for sale. The members voted against this.

The June meeting will be held in Rogue River at the Civic Club.

After the meeting was adjourned, slides of the Fairfield Fashion Show were shown by Gerry Lewis and Margaret Hunsaker.
