MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF JUNE 13, 1987  
HUGO LADIES CLUB

The regular meeting of the Mountain Stars Quilter's Guild was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by President Dorothy Herberg. The outgoing officers were thanked for their service to the organization. Certificates of Appreciation were presented to Gerry Lewis, Vice-President, and to July Kaplan, Secretary. The minutes were approved as printed in the Newsletter, on motion by Gerry Lewis and seconded by Marian Leman. The Treasurer's balance was \$776.24. Donations at the quiltshow totaled \$101.00.

OLD BUSINESS: Anita Ledwidge gave a summary of our Quilt Connection Show. Anita extended the group's thanks to her husband Jack and to Mary Ellis' husband, Bill, for the outstanding quilt frames for displaying the quilts. They will be useful for many years to come. The group gave a round of applause to Anita for her fine job as show coordinator.

Gerry Lewis announced the bus trip to Sisters, Oregon, on July 11, 1987, had paid reservations for 26. We need a total of 40.

Gerry announced plans for the next Moonlighters' meeting. It will be held on Saturday, September 19, 1987, with the location to be announce in the Newsletter. All members are invited to come (and bring friends) to help with this community service project. Many quilts have been made and donated to the community; Dunn House and The Inn Between are two groups we have helped so far. Members are asked to bring a sewing machine, sewing supplies, and fabric scraps. The club supplies the batting.

NEW BUSINESS: Jay Ritter was welcomed as our new Vice-President and Program Coordinator. Our next guest speaker will be Kumiko Sudo, a Japanese silk artist. Her program will feature an hour lecture illustrated with 40 quilted pieces. Cost will be \$5.00. A three-hour workshop will be available in the afternoon. Kits for a camellia purse will be available for \$15.00 if ordered in advance. The workshop price is \$20.00.

Mary Cross, a contemporary and traditional quilter, was quest speaker at our recent Quilt Connection Show. Mary is developing a line of greeting cards and would like to invite members to send a clear photograph or slide of quilts they may have. A monetary gratuity and free cards will be given for photographs selected.

Jay thanked the group for the many cards, plants, and condolences extended because of the loss of her brother.

President Dorothy Herberg appointed Mildred Stephens to serve as hospitality chairman for the Guild.

She also noted that the new quilt frames would be stored at the Hugo Ladies Club; the Guild agreed that the Hugo Club may use them in exchange for the storage.

Anita announced the tentative plans for next year's quilt show, "Quilt For A Day". The Armory in Medford was suggested as a possible site. Demonstrations for the public, a hands-on quilting frame and a fashion show of quilted garments will be featured.

Dora Scheidecker announced she will coordinate a showing of Guild member Leona Miller's twelve wall hangings from Chris Edmond's A QUILT FOR ALL SEASONS booklet. Leona has four more to complete for this series of a theme wallhanging for each month of the year. Jenny Williams has 102 blocks in beautiful pastel shades that could also be featured. The University of Oregon at Eugene will show 100 of Dora's quilt blocks.

A contest was announced regarding a quilt block contest sponsored by Disneyland.

More information regarding a guild pin will be given at the Septemeber meeting by Dorothy.

Marian LEman extended an invitation by the Piecemakers to attend the quilt show in connection with the Rogue River Rooster Crow annual celebration on the last Saturday in June. It will be held on June 27, 1987, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Marian announced a tour for May 4-9, 1988. It would include air transportation to New York, a tour of the Amish Pennsylvania Dutch community, and Washington D.C.

Joyce White volunteered to do a future program of 100 quilt slides she has taken.

The September meeting will be hosted by the Piecemakers at the Woodville Art Museum in Rogue River.

Joyce Coulter showed the Amish style quilt that will be raffled at the Hugo Ladies' Club show on October 3, 1987.

Pat Hatfield explained an example of English paper piecing from about 1937.

Dora Scheidecker brought bags of scraps for members.

Meeting adjourned.
