Anita Ledwidge and Dora Scheidecker are continuing to make arrangements for our May quilt show to be ehld by Mountain Stars in the U.S. Hotel Ballroom in Jacksonville. Work by Jenny Williams and Leona Miller will be featured. Sign-up sheets were passed around for the fashion show, card table demonstrations, and for hostesses.

NEW BUSINESS: Discussion was held on the published amendment to the by-laws. After a reading by Dorothy, a motion passed accepting the change.  
Amended Article VI. Dues. Annual dues of an amount specified by the Board of Directors shall be payable on the anniversary of the month during which the member joined the Guild.

The nominating committee appointed will be Dorothy, Jay, Pat, Mildred Stephens, and Margaret Hunsaker.

A plant and symphony card were sent to Naida McDermitt.

Numbers were drawn and a gift exchange was held with many delightful presents. The Christmas tree ornaments donated by the members were given to Hearthstone Nursing Home in Medford.

The raffle quilt for the Hugo Quilt Show in October will feature the twelve days of Christmas.
