

Mountain Stars Quilters Guild
General Meeting
Masonic Hall, Jacksonville March 9, 1991

President Rachel Razzolini called the meeting to order at 1 PM. The minutes were approved and the treasurer's report was given. Balance is \$2394.19. The treasurer is seeking information regarding the IRS tax exempt status for the guild.

Guests were introduced. There was a large group from Brookings. Their leader, June Hopkins, requested quilts for their show in May. Lavonne Braaten will take care of transportation for quilts. They also brought a beautiful Lone Star quilt which will be raffled.

Vickie Newhouse and Susanne Parker reported on the survey which appeared in the December bulletin. Thirteen people wanted 4 meetings yearly, 7 people wanted 6 meetings, 3 wanted 9, and 4 wanted monthly meetings. Suggestions included more workshops, working on projects and sessions on problem solving. The consensus is that we keep the 4 meeting per year format and use the treasury for speakers and workshop leaders.

The nominating committee reported that no nominees have been found for vice-president or secretary. The membership was encouraged to volunteer and duties of these positions were reviewed. The membership applauded the nomination of Jay Ritter for vice-president and Lavonne Braaten for secretary. Installation will be conducted at the June meeting by Susanne Parker and her committee.

Details of the Mountain Stars Show were reviewed by Anita Ledwidge. It will be on Saturday, May 18 (10-4) at the Girls Gym, Grants Pass High, 9th and A Sts. They are seeking 12½ in. squares for use in a patriotic quilt. Challenge materials have been distributed and projects will be shown. If any fabric remains these packets will be sold so as not to incur a loss for our treasury.

It was reported that the Boise Peace Guild quilt, which was made in conjunction with quilters in Russia, will be shown in Jacksonville this July.

Show and tell followed. Refreshments were served by the Jacksonville members.

Margaret Hunsaker gave a very interesting program on Celtic Interlace showing several examples and demonstrating the technic. Kits were offered.
