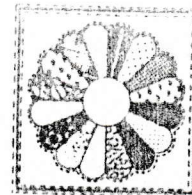


MOUNTAIN STARS QUILTERS GUILD
 MINUTES OF THE MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 14, 1991
 CIVIC CLUB, OAK STREET, ROGUE RIVER, OREGON



The meeting of the Mt. Stars Quilters Guild was called to order at 1:00 P.M. by President Rachel Razzolini, with approximately 25 members present. Lorraine Regnaud joined the Guild at this meeting, and several other guests were present, among them were Liz Clark, Leslie Kramer, Christina Sims, Gaylis Barnhart, Natalie Kruger, Lucille Simonet, Evelyn Robinson, Ellie Leonard, Darrel Dawson, and Lori Drohan. We loved having such a full house, and hope they will join us.

The minutes of the meeting on June 15 were approved as printed in the *News-Letter*. The Treasurer's report was read and approved; the ending balance was \$2563.07.

CHRISTMAS MEETING: The meeting will be held the first Saturday, December 7, in Ashland. A discussion was held concerning the Guild's gifts to our communities' children. It was agreed we would bring pre-wrapped gifts for children under age 12. Gifts should be labelled, for boy or girl, and the approximate age. Suggested price range was \$3-5, but no restrictions were made.

GUILD POLICIES: The policy concerning the selling of raffle tickets by various Guild groups at Mt. Stars Quilt Shows was considered. It was noted that people want to buy raffle tickets, and also noted was the competition this caused for sales of a Mt. Stars Quilt raffle. The question of which groups could sell when no Mt. Stars raffle tickets were offered was also considered. After a wide-ranging discussion President Razzolini appointed a committee to consider this matter and recommend a policy for selling raffle tickets, reporting to the Guild on December 7. Rowena Kerber, (Rogue River) was appointed Chairman of the committee;

other members were Verda Sanders (Medford), Margaret Hunsaker (Hugo), Terry Grant (Ashland), and Vicki Newhouse (Grants Pass). A motion to this effect was made, seconded, and passed. This discussion also included how the Guild raffle quilt, to be raffled in 1993, could be circulated among the area groups for sale of those tickets.

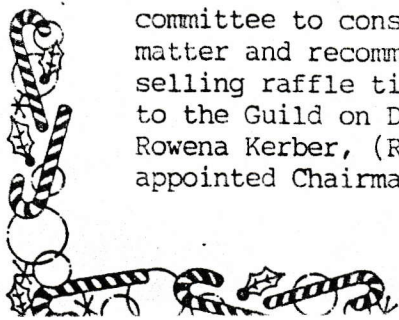
GUILD QUILTS: Pat Hatfield, Chairman of the committee appointed in June to make up the patriotic quilts, and the raffle quilt, reported on the Committee's plans. A design was chosen for the patriotic quilt, which will be made of the Guild members' blocks (shown at the May 12 Quilt Show). This is a 12-block wall hanging, and there will be two 3-block banners to flank the wall hanging.

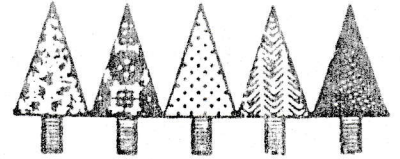
The Committee chose the Raffle Quilt design from "Basket Quilts" by Laura Nownes, the "Basket Medallion" and purchased some of the fabric to be used. The Guild agreed to meet on two work days, October 22 and Nov. 2, at 9 a.m. at the Hugo ladies Club. The patriotic quilts will be basted; templates made and fabric cut, as time permits, for the basket quilt. Pot luck will be the lunch. Other members of this committee are Anita Ledwidge, Joyce Coulter, Jay Ritter, and LaVonne Braaten.

FEATHERED STAR WORKSHOP: Judy Kaplan, co-chairman for the workshop, discussed details of the classes to be held by Louise Kindig, on Oct. 18 and 19, in Rogue River.

PROGRAM: Terry Grant presented an interesting program on the ways silk screening can be used in quilts. she talked about procedures, methods, etc., of the silk screening process, and showed a wide variety of examples she had made. Members were delighted with her program, and urged her to give another workshop on the process.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RAFFLE TICKET SALES

Three members of the committee met on Thursday, November 14, 1991 at the Scrap Peddler in Ashland. A memorandum regarding the issue of ticket sales was distributed and discussion followed. A copy of the memo is attached and is incorporated as part of this report.

The Committee makes the following recommendation:

In the interest of furthering mutual support of all quilt groups and furthering quilt education for members and the community, we propose:

1. The Guild produce one quilt per year.
2. Open sales at quilt show if:
 - A. Groups assume responsibility for one month of displaying the quilt and selling raffle tickets.
 - B. The groups wishing to display their quilts and sell raffle tickets for them, reciprocate by displaying the guild quilt and selling raffle tickets for it at their show.
3. The money generated from raffle ticket sales be used to bring renown speakers/teachers as often as funds permit, for the benefit of members and the community.
4. Explore additional methods of publicizing Mountain Stars Guild and the quilt show for the purpose of generating membership.
