

A supply list for Sue Linker's Dimensional Workshop was passed for those who are signed up for the class. A sample of Barbara Leavitt's work will be shown at the Rogue River Piecemaker show June 25. Barbara's machine quilting class is set for October 1994. Barbara Bachmann, EllynRosas, Maggie Miller and Gerry Lewis were winners of the Amish Fruitbasket Block of the Season.

Twenty plus members participated in show and tell and the meeting adjourned with refreshments served by the Hugo Ladies Club.
